Bob Robison's Middle School Youth class will portray a live nativity during the Christmas musical on December 9 - 11.

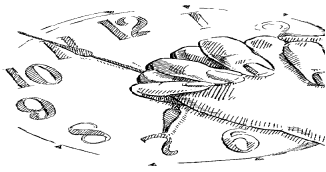

Salisbury is known for the Prayer Vigil, held at Christ Church from 4 PM until midnight.

A Watch Night service is a time for giving thanks for the blessings of the outgoing year and praying for divine favor during the upcoming one. Watch Night can be traced back to a sect of Christians known as the Moravians, who held the first Watchnight Service in Herrnhut, Saxony, in 1732. The practice was later adopted by John Wesley, the founder of Methodism.

Our Prayer Vigil is not a typical Watch Night observance; yet it is a time to come to the church to pray. Enjoy the stillness and quiet that the Sanctuary offers. Stay as long as you like. This is the perfect time and place to meditate on the year passing away, to bring your concerns and leave them at the foot of the Cross, and to start 2012 with the calmness that God brings.

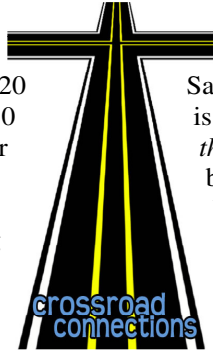

We look forward to more fun and fellowship in the New Year. Plan on joining us!



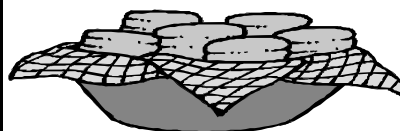
Tips on coping with the holidays for caregivers

Holidays are bittersweet for many caregivers. The happy memories of the past may contrast sharply with the difficulties of the present, and extra demands on time and energy can seem overwhelming. Finding a balance between rest and activity can help.

- * Keep or adapt family traditions that are important to you. Remember to include the person with memory problems or sensory limitations, such as hearing, as much as possible.
- * Recognize that things will be different, and be realistic about what you can do.
- * Encourage friends and family to visit. Limit the number of visitors at one time, and try to schedule visits during the time of day when the person is at his or her best.
- * Avoid crowds, changes in routine, and strange places that may cause confusion or agitation.
- * Try to position the sensory-limited person to maximize their ability to participate in the events around them.
- * Do your best to enjoy yourself. Try to find time for the holiday things you like to do.
- * Ask a friend or family member to spend time with the person while you are out.
- * Encourage physical activities. Spend time outside when the weather permits. Exercise often helps everyone sleep better.

Making a difference

Working as intimately as we do with the young people for such a long time (seven years for some youth), it becomes pretty clear the path a young person will take. Do we, as youth workers, make a difference?

I don't know. This is a question I've asked myself many times over in my 11 years.
